Dear Governor Hochul, Mayor Adams, Commissioner McDonald, and Commissioner Morse:

Over 15,000 New York State (5,000 New York City) nursing home residents died of COVID during early part of the pandemic. We are past the grim five-year anniversary of the infamous March 25, 2020 directive that forced nursing homes to accept COVID patients.

During the intervening 5 years former Governor Cuomo and Dr. Howard Zucker, the former head of DOH, have falsely stated that the <u>March 25, 2020 nursing home directive</u>, compelling nursing homes to accept COVID positive patients, was following CDC and CMS guidelines.

Governor Cuomo's written statement to congress on <u>Sept 10, 2024 stated</u>, on page 7, "DOJ should send a letter to CMS and CDC since the states' advisories were modeled after their guidance."

On June 11, 2024, Governor Cuomo's <u>opening statement to Congressional Select Subcommittee</u>, he wrote that his March 25, 2020 directive followed federal guidelines where he stated on page 3:

"Investigations found that New York's DOH March 25 guidance was consistent with the prior guidelines issued by the federal CMS and CDC on March 4, 9, 13th and 23rd".

He further wrote, on page 4: "The March 13 CMS policy reiterated that nursing homes could keep patients they knew were COVID positive and should accept a COVID positive patient discharged from a hospital."

Dr. Zucker, as reported in the NY Post, on February 20, 2021 quoted from the CMS March 13, 2020 guidance to defend the DOH March 25, 2020 directive yet a simple review shows he merged different sentences from different sections.

During Dr. Zucker's <u>transcribe testimony</u> to the Congressional Select Subcommittee stated:

"But the fact is we followed the CDC guidance that was out at that time, and CMS guidance"

The Congressional Select Subcommittee on the Coronavirus Pandemic released their final reports and can be seen here: <u>Democratic final report</u> and <u>Republicans final report</u>.

The Democrats state, on page 35, when comparing the NYS DOH March 25th directive to the federal guidelines concluded:

"Governor Cuomo was immediately criticized for the Advisory, which also arguably contradicted federal CMS guidance by *requiring* nursing homes to accept patients with a **COVID-19 diagnosis."**

The Republicans state, on pages 230 - 234,

"FINDING: The <u>March 25</u> Directive Was **Inconsistent** with Applicable Federal Guidance Regarding Hospital to Nursing Home Transfers and COVID-19 Related Infection Control."

I am requesting a written determination if the March 25th directive followed federal guidelines. If so, how exactly was it? Show us the sentence(s) in the directive that support that claim along with the supporting parts of the federal guidelines.

We ask you to respond within 14 days.
