The individuals participating truly believe in the American Dream, and they have waited their whole lives to become a citizen of our great nation. We owe it to these new Americans not to pull the rug out from under them.

My wife is an immigrant - one of the happiest days of our lives is when she attended a Naturalization Ceremony and became an American citizen. Stealing that same joy from other to-be-citizens is wrong, plain and simple.

I am committed to working with you to reverse this decision and ensure Naturalization Ceremonies can once again take place in Rockland and Westchester Counties. I urge you to reverse this decision. I look forward to hearing back.
